# PRIMARY CARE SUPPORT ENGLAND SERVICE FAILURES

The BMA GP committee have released the results of their survey to assess the current state of PCSE services. As all practices know from their day to day activity, the service provided by PCSE has been completely unsatisfactory and GPC therefore gave NHS England a deadline to resolve all the outstanding issues by the end of December 2017. Their survey shows PCSE have failed to do this. GPC England have therefore written to Simon Stevens again and they are also preparing a range of actions to empower practices and get a resolution to this unacceptable situation. # NHS ENGLAND REJECTS CALLS FOR A QOF SUSPENSION IN ENGLAND

As practices continue to struggle with high workload demands, GPC wrote to NHS England to request the suspension of QOF until the end of March 2018 to ease pressure in general practice over the winter period. This followed similar action taken by the government in Wales. However NHS England have replied to say they will not suspend QOF at this time. This is very disappointing and is a sign of NHS England's failure to understand the pressure practices are under and to do something material about it.

# **GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATIONS – LMC EVENT**

The new General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) will come into force on 25 May 2018. The BMA is in the process of finalising guidance which will be available in February. These are important changes and to help practices understand what will be required, Leeds LMC will be holding an event on Tuesday 13 March, 7-9pm at Weetwood Hall, Leeds LS16 5PS. We've invited national and local experts to speak. Please make a note of this date and more details will be sent out to practices shortly.

# PRACTICE MANAGER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The GP Forward View committed to investment in the support and development of Practice Managers. Over three years, NHS England will be investing a total of £6m to support the

development of practice managers, which will consist of nationally-led opportunities, along with some locally funded offers.

NHS England has engaged with practice managers to understand their development needs. They received feedback from over 1,000 managers across England who highlighted the areas for support as:

- to connect more often with other practice managers for peer support
- to know more best practice examples for the productive running of the practice
- to be supported to develop a personal development plan for the future
- to develop more advanced management skills required for creating and running at-scale services

Funding has now been allocated to local regions and because the funding is so limited, it has been agreed by local LMCs to pool the resource to try and get the most from it. This may include supporting local networks and developing a system of peer appraisal for practice managers. We will provide practice managers with more details as we get them.

#### **GP RETENTION SCHEME CASE STUDIES**

The BMA GP committee is looking for GPs who have joined the <u>2017 GP Retention Scheme</u> or the 2016 interim scheme to be involved with some work they have planned to promote the scheme. Initial signs are that the revamped scheme is proving popular, but in order to build on this and help make the scheme available to as many GPs as possible, they are keen to use case studies of GPs who have joined the scheme to help raise awareness. It is likely that this will involve the chosen GPs being involved with a video which covers the reasons why they have joined the scheme as an example to other GPs of how it can be useful.

# NEW GUIDELINES FOR THE TREATMENT OF WOUNDS HEALING BY SECONDARY INTENTION – INCLUDING SINUSES AND CAVITIES

#### MEDICINES SHORTAGES

We have received the following message from Ruth Buchan, Chief Executive Officer at CPWY: "There are currently very high levels of medicines shortages. These are having a massive impact on community pharmacy, CCGs, GPs and most importantly patients. Pharmacy teams are working hard to source these vital medicines for patients. Pharmacists are doing all kinds of things to assist patients, such as "staged" dispensing, liaising with GPs to find alternatives, making numerous phone calls to wholesalers etc. I am sure that you can appreciate that the workload this creates is massive."

Please see attached to this edition of ViewPoint a briefing regarding the current medicines shortages. This briefing answers a number of key questions about the generics supply situation, and explains how prescribers can help support both pharmacies and patients.

# LEASE INCENTIVES FOR GP PRACTICES

NHS England have extended the deadline for the Lease incentive scheme to **31 March 2018**. This will cover reimbursement of stamp duty, contribution to legal fees and VAT for tenants of NHS Property Services and Community Health Partnerships. While GPC welcomes the extension, they have repeatedly made the point to NHS England that the issue of service charges needs to be urgently resolved, before practices take advantage of this funding. Their advice to practices has not changed. Transitional arrangements are being offered to either:

- 1. Cover increased costs that NHSPS with to charge; or
- 2. Act as an incentive for practices to sign a new lease.

Such arrangements should only be entered into where you are entirely satisfied that when the transitional period ends you are not inadvertently left having to meet increased costs without the benefit of increased funding. In the view of BMA, transitional agreements are not the solution. More permanent arrangements which align a practices' funding to their costs are needed. # **GUIDANCE FOR GPs WORKING FOR ONLINE PROVIDERS**
