## **Physician Associates (PA) in Primary Care**

The GPFV made a specific commitment for HEE to train 1,000 Physician Associates into general practice by 2020.

Physician associates have an increasing role to play in primary care as part of a multi-skilled workforce, and HEE continues to invest in the growth of the PA profession, supporting both education and workforce development.

HEE are committed to supporting the development of multi-professional primary care teams. A number of initiatives have been put in place to help primary care workforce leads understand the role, development needs and potential for PAs in General Practice. We would like to share some of these initiatives with you.

HEE have developed a single, nationally aligned investment model for PA education and training, and further information regarding this can be accessed [here](#). We would encourage you to circulate the details of this funding model with your partners, via your own forums and channels. This targeted investment model will support all student PAs and provide an incentive and development opportunity for graduates who choose primary care-based careers.
