CQC – Ratings of Leeds Practices

Leeds LMC officers met recently with CQC lead inspection managers for primary care medical services across West Yorkshire and Harrogate. They reported that as at August 2019 there were 97 GP practices registered in Leeds with 4% rated as outstanding overall and 96% rated as good overall.

The CQC managers confirmed that it is rare nationally for **all practices** in an area to be rated as either good or outstanding and we believe this excellent result is a real reflection of the hard work and dedication shown by practice staff in Leeds. The LMC offers everyone involved our warm congratulations.

The current ratings for the whole of the West Yorkshire and Harrogate area are 5% outstanding, 92% good, 2% requires improvement and 1% inadequate.

The CQC inspectors noted the following key messages based upon their inspections over the past 12-18 months:

- there is a clear and distinct link between good governance and patient safety;
- services rated as good or outstanding have good governance systems in place;
- the role of the registered person in setting a good example by taking ownership and responsibility for matters is key to good governance.

Letter to Prime Minister on practice premises funding

In an article for the <u>Sunday Times</u>, the Prime Minister pledged a further £1.8bn in funding for capital projects, with a focus on hospitals. In response to this, the BMA's chair of council, Chand Nagpaul, said "If the Prime Minister is serious about improving care and tackling waiting times he must give patients reassurance that senior hospital doctors and GPs will be able to continue to provide care, and not be forced out by absurd taxes on their pensions that mean all too often they are paying to go to work." He also said that that the funding was a 'step forward' and that 'more funding must be made available to address the impoverished state of general practice buildings so that there is increased capacity for GP staff and services'.

Dr Richard Vautrey wrote a letter to the Prime Minister (attached), co-signed by the RCGP, Patients Association, the National Association of Primary Care and the Family Doctor Association, calling for urgent action to ensure that vital capital funding is allocated for primary care premises. This follows the GPC's <u>premises survey</u> that showed that only half of practices considered their premises to be fit for present needs, falling to just over 2 in 10 practices when asked if they thought their premises were fit for the future. In addition the recent NHS England GP premises review which GPC England were part of also concluded that significant additional funding is required for primary care premises. If the government is to deliver on the new Prime Minister's commitment to improve access to general practice appointments, then long overdue investment in premises must be a priority.

Data sharing agreement

NHS England and the GPC England have agreed on a non-mandatory, high-level data sharing template for use by PCNs. To make things simpler for practices, the BMA has also produced a version of the agreed template which expands on a number of areas with greater detail, along with guidance on the document. This provides practices with a better idea of how they may wish to populate the template agreement, including proposed best practice when sharing and transferring data between partners within the network. Additional roles reimbursement guidance

NHS England has now published the joint guidance on the <u>Additional Roles</u> <u>Reimbursement Scheme</u> (ARRS) that will commence in April 2020. The GPC hope that by releasing it now, PCNs will be able to better prepare for the additional workforce from 2020. This guidance includes the process by which Primary Care Networks (PCNs) can claim reimbursement for additional staff.

Employment of PCN Pharmacists

Please see new national guidance below provided by the GP Confederation around the use of this year's workforce additionality payments:

PCNs should plan in advance for how they are expecting to use their allocation. In 2019/20, if PCNs are not planning to use their full entitlement as a result of a lag in recruiting the additional roles, they should look to bring forward the recruitment of a further additional clinical pharmacist or link worker into 2019/20 (on terms set out in the Network Contract DES) in order to use the full entitlement of nine months' WTE funding for the reimbursable roles as set out in table 1. In taking this decision, PCNs should assure

themselves that the increase in scheme funding for 2020/21 will support that position. Equally, the same applies in subsequent years where PCNs may find they have some of their entitlement remaining towards the end of the year.

NHS England FAQs on Integrated Care Providers Contract

NHS England have released some explanatory FAQs on how the Integrated Care Providers (ICP) contract will operate and what will be the impact of the contract. The GPC have repeatedly highlighted our serious concerns about the ICP contract and that we believe it to be unnecessary with the development of PCNs.

The FAQs cover many of the same issues covered in the BMA's own guidance and briefings on ICPs. However, there are some questions within the document of particular relevance to GPs in England. The most relevant questions are; 13, 14, 15 and 17. These particular questions cover; how GPs participation in ICPs is voluntary, the different options available to GPs who do decide to partner with ICPs and, how ICPs will engage with PCNs.

GMS and PMS amendment regulations

Following the contract agreement in England earlier this year, the GMS and PMS amendment regulations have been laid before Parliament and have now been published on the <u>gov.uk website</u>. These amendment regulations will come into force from 1 October 2019. As usual, this is an amendment and not a new consolidated version of the full regulations, therefore the amendment must be read in conjunction with the <u>2015</u> <u>consolidated regulations</u>.

Registration onto the Medicine and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) Central Alerting System (CAS)

The Medicine and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) Central Alerting System (CAS) is the national system for issuing patient safety alerts, important public health messages and other safety critical information to all providers, including GP practices. From 1 October 2019, MHRA will send CAS alerts directly to GP practices, replacing any local arrangements currently in place. All GP practices in England are contractually required to register to receive CAS alerts directly from the MHRA by accessing this link to the portal. Registration is recommended to be completed by 13 September 2019 to allow sufficient time for registration checks and testing.

Clinical Practice Research Datalink

Practices are invited to share their patient databases with <u>Clinical Practice Research</u> <u>Datalink (CPRD)</u>. Practices can expect CPRD to be contacting them in the future and we would encourage them to participate. The GPC IT policy team have been working with CPRD and are satisfied with their systems. No free text is extracted, nor documents nor associated files, just the coded components. Opt outs, as recorded in the practices database are respected. Practices will need to carry out a Data Protection Impact Assessment (DPIA) and add an entry in their Article 30 processing register (CPRD will provide pre-prepared sample documents for practices to use, which the BMA have seen and reviewed). You will need to ensure your privacy notices are up to date and cover the use of patient data for research.

Social Prescribing update

Please see the attached update from NHS Leeds CCG re Linking Leeds, the new city-wide Social Prescribing service starting from 1st September 2019.

Safeguarding reports and CNSGP

Following further discussions on some of the finer definitions of the scope of CNSGP in England, the GPC have agreed with DHSC and NHS Resolution that the compiling of safeguarding reports for NHS patients will now be included within scope. It was initially thought that as these reports can be chargeable under collaborative fees arrangements, they should be deemed to be private work and therefore out of scope. However, the GPC made the case that these are statutory reports which should be reimbursed by the system rather than a private service to patients. This perspective has been accepted by DHSC and NHSR and therefore actions originating from the completion of safeguarding reports after 1st April 2019 will be covered by CNSGP.

Safeguarding Training Update

The first edition of the Adult Safeguarding: Roles and Competencies for Health Care Staff - INTERCOLLEGIATE DOCUMENT (ICD) was published in August 2018 and subsequently the fourth edition of the Safeguarding Children and Young People Roles and Competencies for Healthcare staff - INTERCOLLEGIATE DOCUMENT was released in January 2019. Timely updates were provided to primary care upon publication of each of the documents and the safeguarding team are also booked to present the ICD document changes in the November TARGET series.

To support primary care in achieving competencies as described in the ICDs, the CCG safeguarding team will continue to offer a robust and flexible Level 3 training schedule with sessions being offered at a number of venues, via external and internal Target and within PCNs.

Leeds Sexual Health

Thank you to all those practices who have returned their signed LARC contract to Emma Tiernan at Leeds Community Healthcare NHS Trust (LCH), if you haven't yet done so please can you do this by the deadline of 31st August. If you do not return your contract, LCH will assume you no longer wish to provide this service and you will be removed from the payment system. On the latter point, all invoices up to and including June 2019 should now have been submitted via Pharmoutcomes. The system will shortly be closing for GP Practices. All invoices from July 2019 onwards should be submitted via the new system Tradeshift on a quarterly basis. Training is available for the new system and templates should you require this. • Previous research has indicated that this intervention leads to significant increases in general wellbeing and emotional health (Flaxman & Bond, 2006).

Important Suture Drug Tariff Information

Please see attached new product codes for the reimbursable Ethilon® sutures used by GPs in minor surgery as personally administered items.

Please update GPs in your surgery on the change and advise that those who wish to claim back the tariff price of these sutures may have to either a) hand write the FP10s or b) alter the printed FP10s by hand.

Tier 2 visa sponsorship

Perhaps you are hoping to recruit a new GP or provide supervision for a GP on the international GP Recruitment scheme?

Now is a good time to consider becoming a Tier 2 visa sponsor. GP registrars from non-EU countries are looking for posts and the international recruitment programme is expanding into more non-EU countries.

All of the costs are currently being reimbursed. Individual practices employing international GPs no longer have to complete the Resident Labour Market Test as this has been covered nationally.

Becoming a sponsor and getting a certificate of sponsorship for a specific doctor can take 4-6 months so if you begin at the point when it is needed it can be too late. Your LMC are able to advise further if needed.
